A LETTER FROM DOUGLAS MCCONNELL

For most Chicagoans, putting words together like "Chicago River Swim" are as far-fetched as "Cubs Win the World Series." Wait... after a century, the Cubs DID win the World Series! It has also been a century since there has been a Chicago River Swim, and it is high time to celebrate. It is time to celebrate the fact that the Chicago River is the reason that Chicago is here at all. It is time to celebrate the fact that, after 50 years of dedicated focus and attention, the Chicago River is clean enough for swimmer contact.

The Chicago River Swim will provide the opportunity for these remarkable athletes to swim one- or two- mile courses. They will swim among Chicago's iconic buildings, under Chicago's signature trunnion bascule bridges, and along Chicago's popular Riverwalk, all with abundant locations for spectators. Chicago River Swim is hosted by the nonprofit I co-founded, called A Long Swim, which has raised more than \$2 million for collaborative ALS research at Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine. Proceeds from the Chicago River Swim will support ALS research, as well as water safety lessons for 2,000 Chicago children.

To date, A Long Swim has focused on ALS research in the Ozdinler Lab at Northwestern, and the results have been outstanding. Through its dedication to collaboration with ALS research centers around the world, the Ozdinler Lab's work in neurodegenerative diseases has led to the point where it now has a drug in Phase 1 safety trials in the FDA approval process. It is a very exciting time to be involved in ALS research, and we won't stop until there is a cure to this dreadful disease.

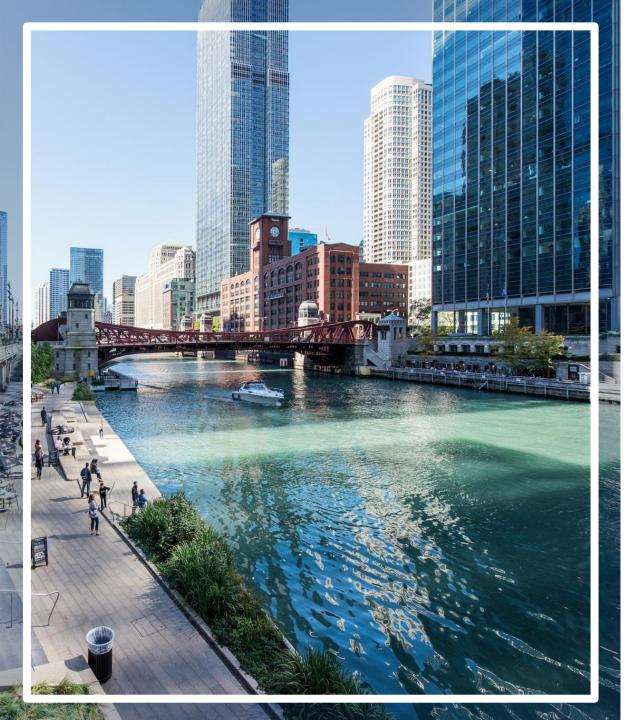
Regarding swimming lessons, we believe that water safety is a human right. Too many children never have the opportunity to learn to swim and, sadly, it is reflected in drowning statistics. Through a handful of focused and well-taught lessons, the risk of drowning can be reduced by 90%, and we can't think of a better high-profile event to provide the beginnings of a solution to this grave issue.

Chicago River Swim will provide our sponsors with unique opportunities to align with these unique priorities, as well as to be prominently featured with a firsttime-in-anyone's-lifetime event that is projected to attract more than one billion impressions.

This September, we're bringing the beloved sport of open water swimming back to the Chicago River. For the first time in nearly 100 years, endurance athletes will have the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to race under the city's iconic bridges and through a stadium of skyscrapers.

A LONG HISTORY OF RIVER SWIMMING

After reversing its water flow in 1900, the Chicago River experienced significant water quality improvements and swim competitions soon began taking place to celebrate. Hosted by the Illinois Athletic Club until the 1920s, these events attracted upwards of 100,000 spectators and drew some of the highest profile swimmers at the time to the city - including Johnny Weissmuller and Buster Crabbe. Unfortunately, the river's water quality significantly deteriorated over the next few decades and the swims were ultimately discontinued.

New legislation began taking action to reverse this in the 1940s and by the 1970s, the river started to experience a new revival. Now, 50 years later, and with *tremendous* public and private support, the river is at its <u>cleanest levels ever recorded</u>.

This year, history will be made once again as the city comes together to celebrate the rebirth of the beloved Chicago River. Will you join us?

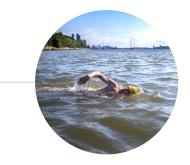

A Long Swim has raised more than \$2 million from swims completed by Doug McConnell, which include the English Channel, Tampa Bay, Catalina Channel, Manhattan Island and more, as well as its "Summer Series Open Water Swims" in Lake Michigan.

It's contributions have made immense impacts in driving breakthrough ALS research, most notable through it's direct support of renowned **The Ozdinler Lab at Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine**.

The Ozdinler Lab has made world-class discoveries related to ALS, including the discovery of the NU-9 compound (now AKV-9) which has shown to reverse ALS neuron damage. AKV-9 has been granted orphan drug status by the FDA, and is now embarking on Phase 1 safety trials at the FDA.
