A RICH CHICAGO TRADITION TO CELEBRATE ***


The Chicago River's flow was reversed 125 years ago to draw fresh water from Lake Michigan and clean a polluted river. To celebrate the waterway's drastic turnaround, the Illinois Athletic Association hosted a series of open water swims in 1908. The swims attracted the highest-profile swimmers and more than 100,000 spectators.

The events were abandoned in the late 1920s as industrial discharge and street runoff again poisoned the river. Through activism and legislation born in the 1960s and 1970s, the Chicago River is now at its cleanest levels on record.








SAFETY

A 100% COMMITMENT TO SAFETY ***

The Chicago River Swim Safety Plan exceeds industry standards by using proven protocols from similar events and scaling-up personnel and watercraft support. The Safety Plan:

- Has evolved over the past 12 years
- Is authored by 20-year event managers from the Chicago Triathlon and 12 other nationallyacclaimed swimming events
- Has embraced input and refinement from:
 - All City Safety Departments (CFD, CPD, CDOT)
 Race Directors of urban swims around the world
- Is more comprehensive than the analogous plans for St. Patrick's Day River Dyeing, the Rubber Duck Derby, and even the New Years Eve Fireworks events
- Has been benchmarked against open water swimming events around the world and is the most conservative overall




